Valour Road

Canadians fought and died in battles at Ypres, Mount Sorrel, Beaumont Hamel, Courcellette, Vimy Ridge, Passchendaele, and Amiens. Sixty-nine Canadian soldiers earned the Victoria Cross in World War I, and by some strange coincidence, three of them lived on the same street -- Pine Street in Winnipeg.

This street was renamed *Valour Road* in recognition of the courage of these three young men, Corporal Leo Clarke, Sergeant-Major Fredrick William Hall and Lieutenant Robert Shankland.

The Victoria Cross is the highest recognition for valour "in the face of the enemy" that can be awarded to members of the British and Commonwealth armed forces of any rank in any service, and civilians under military command. It is also the highest military award in the British honours system.

The road was made famous by a 1991 CRB Foundation vignette that was aired frequently on most Canadian TV stations. The vignette dramatized Hall's rescue attempt and Clarke's capture of several German soldiers, then explained the story of the men's common origin with a voiceover. The film short helped Valour Road become one of the most famous streets in the country.
