Thomas's wife Jenette, age 87, still lives in Australia and was thrilled that her husband's two nieces could attend the dedication.

Thomas served two years and ten months on board the Ajax during which time he saw action at the Battle of the River Plate. H.M.S. Ajax was known as the "White Lady of the South Seas" and even in peace time she had a great reputation.
