My name is Randy Young President of Friends of Veterans Canada. Our charity tour of Canada to bring awareness to video taping our WW2 and Korean veterans is set to start May 1 2008. This "Veterans Video Awareness Tour" will be stopping at 23+ cities across Canada and organizing a "Rally for Veterans" Appreciation Day in each of the cities on the tour as a vehicle to bring the media and the public to the issue of video tapping our veterans. We here at Friends of Veterans Canada are dedicated to this mission.

My ad that I placed in the November issue, looking for dispatch riders was very successful. We have DR'S to interview in all of the provinces throughout Canada except P.E.I. and N.F.LD, and I'm working on those.

We need to get our message out to all veterans and legions across Canada that we will be in their province this year and we need their support as far as handing a poster in their Legion and getting the word out to all local veterans that we are going to be there on such and such a date. We also would like to make the legions a place to finish the days Rally for Veterans and possibly have some type of dance or something to raise some donations to keep the tour going.

Below I will include our itinerary for our "Coast to Coast Tour"

Our first fund raiser dance will be held on Sat. April 5, 2008 at the Cambridge fair grounds in the Dixon Arena. All the proceeds will go directly to funding the Veterans Video Awareness Tour. The first "Rally for Veterans" Appreciation Day is set to go on April 26, 2008 from Veterans Green in Waterloo Ontario with registration at 10:30 am. The ride (of motorcycles and Veterans in Cars) will travel, with a police escort, through Kitchener down King St. to the Kitchener Memorial Auditorium. We are expecting about 300 people and hopefully a large number of veterans (with your help).
